Minister Meeting outcomes and actions

- The chair read the ministers letter to the group regarding their concerns around enforcing compliance and including it in procurement as an option to gain compliance. The group then had a discussion to draft a letter of response of next steps to the minister in regards to options for procurement and compliance. Discussion of what timelines will be to enact this, monitor and communicate to public, and what the criteria will be around this. Suggesting examples such as Green Buildings that were procured already, and use the same strategy as what was used in this case.

Transportation

The Accessible Transportation Standard is completed, just waiting on the Ministers final stamp and it will be posted on Engage MB For a 60 day public consultation.

Looking a bit further ahead, once the consultation period ends the AAC will then review comments received and any revisions to the standard likely in March / April.

• Design of Public Outdoor Spaces

DOPS – the standard is in it's preliminary stages. The DOPS committee has been brought back together as the legislative drafters had questions for them. So we had a productive meeting Nov 30th and have another one tomorrow to complete the remainder of the questions.

Other Business
